## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGIES

Franklin ActiveQuant Canadian Fund (the “Fund”) aims to grow investors’ capital over the long term by investing primarily in a diversified portfolio of Canadian equities. The Fund invests in Canadian equities and income trusts that are carefully selected based on a quantitative approach using a predetermined quantitative screening model that identifies securities based on different selection criteria chosen by the portfolio advisor (the “portfolio manager”). The model incorporates a mix of various historical and projected financial and stock market data.

## RISK

The risks of investing in the Fund remain as stated in the prospectus. The Fund is suitable for investors who are seeking a core Canadian equity fund and are willing to accept low to medium investment risk over the medium to long term.

## RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

As at December 31, 2017, total net asset value of the Fund was \$445.4 million, an increase of 3.6% from December 31, 2016. This was primarily driven by an increase of \$25.0 million in net assets from operations and partially offset by \$9.6 million in net redemptions. The Fund paid out \$12,000 in cash distributions to unitholders.

During the past year, the Fund’s Series A units generated total returns of 3.7%. Over the same time period, the Fund’s benchmark, the S&P/TSX Composite Total Return Index (the “Index”), returned 9.1%. The performance of the Fund’s other series is similar to that of its Series A units, except for differences in expense structure. For the return of the Fund’s other series (if applicable), please refer to the “Past Performance” section.

The Fund underperformed the Index during the 12-month reporting period, mainly due to a negative security selection effect, which was partially offset by a positive sector allocation effect. The Fund underperformed in the Financials, Materials, Industrials and Energy sectors.

In the Financials sector, the Fund incurred a negative security selection effect, as well as a negative sector allocation effect due to its underweighting in this outperforming sector. Home Capital Group Inc. was one of the weakest equities in the Fund and was eliminated during the period.

In the Materials sector, the Fund incurred a negative security selection effect. Norbord Inc. was added during 2017 and underperformed during its holding period. Relative performance was also impacted by not owning Franco-Nevada Corp., Teck Resources Ltd., First Quantum Minerals Ltd. and Kirkland Lake Gold Ltd., which gained approximately 27%, 25%, 32% and 175%, respectively.

In the Industrials sector, the Fund experienced negative security selection effect, which was partially offset by positive sector allocation effect due to its overweighting in this outperforming sector. Relative performance was diminished by not owning Waste Connections Inc. and Air Canada, which advanced 28% and 89%, respectively, during the period.

In the Energy sector, the Fund incurred a negative security selection effect, which was partially offset by a positive sector allocation effect due to its underweighting in this underperforming sector. Peyto Exploration & Development Corp. was the single worst-performing equity in the Fund, returning -52%. Tourmaline Oil Corp. and Imperial Oil Ltd. were also laggards, returning -37% and -15%, respectively.

However, in Consumer Discretionary, the Fund gained from positive security selection, and positive sector allocation due to its overweighting in this outperforming sector. Dollarama Inc., Quebecor Inc., Magna International Inc. and Canadian Tire Corp. Ltd. were all among the top-performing equities, gaining 60%, 28%, 25% and 20%, respectively.

Index performance comparison information is provided for reference only. It is important to note that the Fund’s return reflects the effect of fees and expenses for professional management, while an index does not have such costs.

Expenses have decreased for the year ended December 31, 2017, due to fluctuations in average net assets of those series that bear expenses. Income received from investments held, excluding net realized and/or unrealized gain (loss) on investments and derivatives, increased due to the results of the Fund’s investment activities, including, but not limited to, those previously discussed for the period in review.

## RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

Going into 2018, the portfolio manager remains comfortable with the Fund's current holdings against a backdrop of rising interest rates and strengthening commodity prices. The portfolio manager's focus on buying equities that exhibit low valuations, high levels of profitability and low risk levels should benefit the Fund in the event of increased market volatility.

## RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Manager is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of Franklin Resources, Inc., a global investment management organization known as Franklin Templeton Investments. The Manager is the manager, registrar and transfer agent and a principal distributor of the Fund. The Manager provides or arranges for the provision of these services for day-to-day Fund operations, including the marketing, promotion and distribution of the Fund and portfolio advisory services. In consideration of these management and portfolio advisory services, the Fund pays the

Manager a monthly management fee plus applicable taxes, based on the average net asset value of each series of the Fund (except Series O and OT, as applicable), calculated daily, as set out under Management Fees below. During the year ended December 31, 2017, the Fund paid management fees of \$494,000 (2016-\$580,000).

Franklin Templeton Services, LLC (FTS) provides the Manager with fund accounting and portfolio valuation services in connection with the Fund, and provides certain back office administration services to the Manager. The Administration Fee, as discussed below, covers the cost of the services provided by FTS.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain fund costs—which include, but are not limited to, the cost of compliance with new governmental and regulatory requirements, fees and expenses of the Fund's Independent Review Committee (IRC), borrowing and interest costs and investor meeting costs (as permitted by Canadian securities regulation)—in exchange for the payment by the Fund of an annual fixed-rate administration fee of 0.23% plus applicable taxes, applied against the average daily net assets of the Fund ("Administration Fee"), except for Series PF, which has an annual Administration Fee of 0.15%, and Series O and OT, which have no annual Administration Fee. The Manager will pay all operating expenses of Series O and OT, as applicable, as part of its agreement with each investor. The Manager may, at its discretion, waive a portion of a series' Administration Fee or absorb certain fund costs. During the year ended December 31, 2017, the Fund paid Administration Fees of \$70,000 (2016-\$72,000).

During the year ended December 31, 2017, the Manager waived fund costs of \$3,000 (2016-\$3,000).

As at December 31, 2017, Franklin Quotential Balanced Growth Portfolio and Franklin Bissett Canadian Balanced Fund held 24% and 14% of the Fund, respectively.

## Portfolio Advisor

Franklin Bissett Investment Management (the "Portfolio Advisor"), part of the Manager, provides investment analysis and recommendations and executes or arranges for brokers to execute portfolio transactions.

## Principal Distributor

As a principal distributor of the Fund, the Manager markets the Fund and arranges for the sale of the Fund through dealers across Canada. The Manager may retain companies to assist in the sale of certain series of units of the Fund.

The Manager's affiliate, FTC Investor Services Inc. ("FTC ISI"), also acts as a principal distributor for Series F, O, OT, FT, PF and PF (Hedged) units of the Fund, as applicable.

For acting as a principal distributor of the applicable series, FTC ISI receives an inter-company service fee of 0.20% of the assets under management of the applicable series from the Manager with respect to those series of units.

### **Registrar and Transfer Agent**

In addition to management and portfolio advisory services, the Manager acts as the registrar and transfer agent of the Fund. These services are in the normal course of operations and are covered by the Administration Fee paid by the Fund to the Manager.

### **Standing Instructions from the Independent Review Committee**

The Manager relied on standing instructions from the IRC with respect to the allocation of any operating expenses not covered by the Administration Fee. The Manager relied, or may rely, on standing instructions from the IRC in respect of securities trades amongst mutual funds, investment funds or managed accounts managed by the Manager or an affiliate of the Manager. In both cases, the standing instructions require the Manager to comply with the policies and procedures presented to the IRC with respect to the above matters and to provide periodic reports to the IRC in accordance with NI 81-107.

### **MANAGEMENT FEES**

A portion of the management fee paid by the Fund to the Manager is for trail fees and sales commissions the Manager pays to dealers (“Dealer Compensation”). The trail fees are a percentage of the daily average net asset value of each series of the Fund, which is held by the dealer’s clients. The remaining portion of the management fee is used to pay for portfolio advisory and administrative services related to the provision of portfolio advisory services. The table below outlines the Fund’s annual management fee, as well as the portion of the management fee used to pay for Dealer Compensation and for portfolio advisory services as an approximate percentage of the management fee for each series:

Certain institutional investors may negotiate the management and administration fees by written agreement with Franklin Templeton Investments.

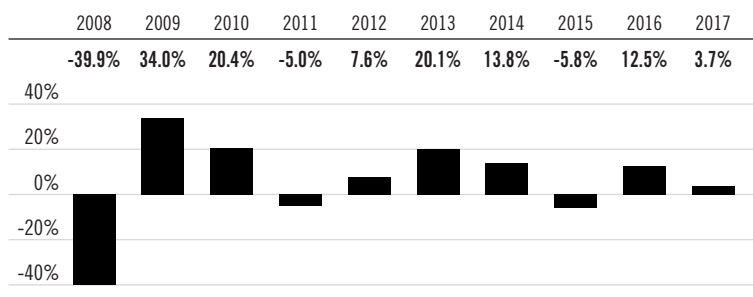

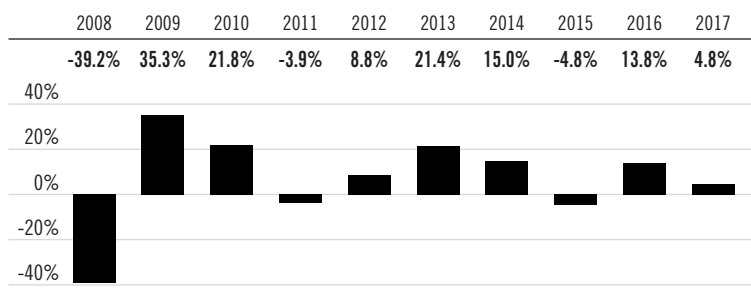

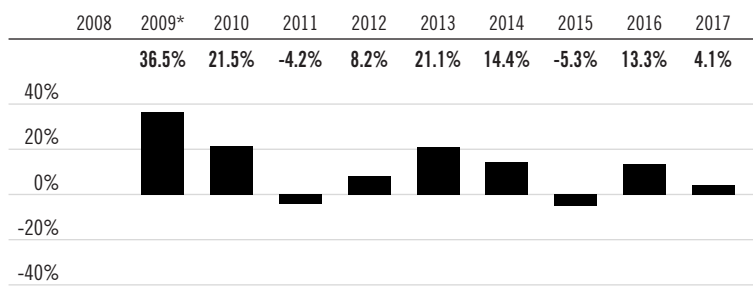

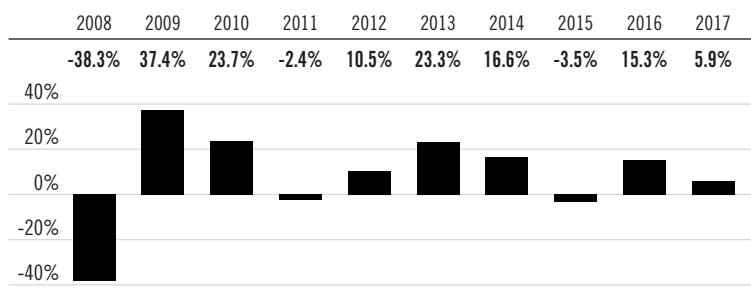

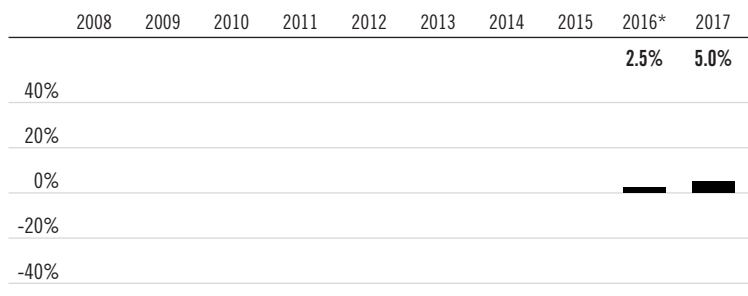

### Net Assets per Unit:

- (1) This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements. In the period a fund or series is established, the financial information is provided from the date of inception to the end of the period. In cases where the net assets per unit presented in the financial statements differ from the net asset value calculated for Fund pricing purposes, an explanation of these differences can be found in the notes to the financial statements.
- (2) Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease in net assets from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the fiscal period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of opening and closing net assets per unit.
- (3) Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional units of the Fund or both, and exclude distributions of management fee reductions to unitholders.

### Ratios and Supplemental Data:

- (1) This information is provided as at the period-end of the year shown.
- (2) Management expense ratio is based on total expenses for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.
- (3) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of net asset value during the period.
- (4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio manager manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling each security in its portfolio once in the course of the relevant period. The higher the portfolio turnover rate in the period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund.

## BENCHMARK(S) INFORMATION

**S&P/TSX Composite TR Index** measures the total return (dividends are reinvested) of the largest Canadian companies, in terms of three-year average quoted market value, listed on the TSX. The S&P/TSX Composite Index was formerly called The Toronto Stock Exchange 300 Total Return Index (TSE 300).
