INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGIES

Franklin Bissett Dividend Income Corporate Class (the “Fund”) aims to grow investors’ capital over the long term by investing substantially all of its assets in units of Franklin Bissett Dividend Income Fund (the “Underlying Fund”). The Underlying Fund seeks high current income by investing primarily in dividend-paying Canadian and American preferred and common stocks. The Fund also holds up to 25% of its total assets in bonds to reduce volatility and enhance income.

The Franklin Bissett equity team applies a bottom-up research approach to identify companies with a history of sustainable, profitable growth. One of the many selection criteria in this process is that chosen stocks have attractive valuations relative to the intrinsic value of the business. As every Franklin Bissett equity manager is committed to GARP-style investing, each Underlying Fund holding will have been identified for growth prospects and have been purchased at what the portfolio manager considered to be a reasonable valuation.

Income generation is a key focus for the Underlying Fund, and all investments must generate reasonable yields. As a result, it is expected that over time, dividends will represent a meaningful component of total returns.

RISK

The risks of investing in the Fund remain as stated in the prospectus. The Fund is suitable for conservative investors with a medium- to long-term investment horizon and low to medium risk tolerance, who are seeking dividend income, some capital gains and possibly some interest income.

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

As at December 31, 2017, total net asset value of the Fund was \$20.8 million, a decrease of 11.0% from December 31, 2016. This was primarily driven by \$3.2 million in net redemptions and partially offset by an increase of \$858,000 in net assets from operations. The Fund paid out \$202,000 in cash distributions to shareholders.

During the past year, the Fund’s Series A shares generated total returns of 3.3%. As the Fund is composed of a blend of Canadian equities, fixed income investments and US equities, it employs a custom benchmark, the Custom Franklin Bissett Dividend Income Benchmark (the

“Benchmark”), which returned 9.4% over the period in review. Over the same time period, the S&P/TSX Composite Total Return Index returned 9.1%, in Canadian-dollar terms. The performance of the Fund’s other series is similar to that of its Series A shares, except for differences in expense structure. For the return of the Fund’s other series (if applicable), please refer to the “Past Performance” section.

The Fund invests substantially all of its assets in units of Franklin Bissett Dividend Income Fund, and accordingly the discussion that follows pertains to this Underlying Fund. The Fund underperformed the Benchmark during the reporting period. Underperformance in US and Canadian equities was slightly offset by outperformance in fixed income. Other than the Fund’s minimal cash balance, all categories produced positive absolute returns.

US equities were the most significant detractor from relative returns. Although realizing slightly positive total returns, this category significantly lagged the S&P 500 Total Return Index, which advanced 14.1%. General Electric Co. was the main individual underperformer, declining 46.7%. General Electric provided a business update during the fourth quarter, disclosing disappointing earnings and free cash-flow guidance. Upon evaluation of the new guidance and given the drop in share price, the portfolio manager decided to maintain the portfolio’s position, despite the negative impact on the intrinsic value of the business. As always, the portfolio manager’s valuation and investment thesis are founded on long-term projections of profitability. The portfolio manager’s ongoing assessment of the turnaround and restructuring efforts, and the extent to which it believes they improve profitability, will be of key importance.

Canadian equities also weighed on relative returns, but to a lesser extent. Even though returns in this category were positive and higher than for US equities, they lagged the S&P/TSX Composite Total Return Index by approximately 250 basis points. Peyto Exploration & Development Corp. in the Energy sector was the second-worst detractor from the Fund’s overall relative performance, returning -52.3%. The business faced ongoing challenges due to continued weakness in natural gas prices. Management continues to focus on minimizing costs, while growing the production base. The company benefits from its low decline rates compared to peers. This allows for modest capital expenditures, which is crucial for a price-taker business.

On the other hand, contributors in the equity sleeves were McDonald’s Corp., which continued to benefit from better operating results and gained 35.3%; IGM Financial Inc., which recovered as it continued to generate strong profitability despite a challenging environment, benefitting from its strong distribution presence across Canada, and increased 21.9%; and Brookfield Infrastructure Partners LP, which advanced 30.4%, and continues to opportunistically deploy capital around the globe, leveraging its reputation and strong merger-and-acquisition capabilities to build its portfolio of energy, communications, utilities and transportation infrastructure assets.

The fixed income category, including preferred shares, bolstered relative performance. Both bonds and preferred share returns outpaced that of their respective indices in the Benchmark.

Average net assets of the series of the Fund that bear expenses have remained relatively flat for the year ended December 31, 2017, resulting in expenses remaining relatively unchanged during the period. Income received from investments held, excluding net realized and/or unrealized gain (loss) on investments and derivatives, decreased due to the results of the Fund's investment activities, including, but not limited to, those previously discussed for the period in review.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

The portfolio manager remains cautiously optimistic entering 2018. While US and Canadian equities remain in an extended bull market, suggesting some vulnerability to a pullback, sector returns have been substantially divergent over the past few years, providing some windows of opportunity. The Energy sector, after contributing significantly in 2016, was a significant drag on performance in 2017. A number of Fund holdings are priced well below the portfolio manager's estimate of intrinsic value, and it expects this gap to narrow. Within Financials, the Fund continues to have an overweighted position within Canadian banks that has benefitted performance. Share-price appreciation among banks has caused the portfolio manager to trim the Fund's exposure as part of the normal course of portfolio-rebalancing activities. However, the portfolio manager remains positive on the outlook for financial services, especially if interest rates should continue to rise from their currently very low levels.

The portfolio manager believes there is sufficient opportunity within the US and Canadian equity markets to construct a dividend-oriented portfolio that meets or exceeds the Fund's long-term equity return objectives.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Manager is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of Franklin Resources, Inc., a global investment management organization known as Franklin Templeton Investments. The Manager is the manager, registrar and transfer agent and a principal distributor of the Fund. The Manager provides or arranges for the provision of these services for day-to-day Fund operations, including the marketing, promotion and distribution of the Fund and portfolio advisory services. In consideration of these management and portfolio advisory services, the Fund pays the Manager a monthly management fee plus applicable taxes, based on the average net asset value of each series of the Fund (except Series O and OT, as applicable), calculated daily, as set out under Management Fees below. During the year ended December 31, 2017, the Fund paid management fees of \$331,000 (2016—\$356,000), after management fee waivers of \$1,000 (2016—\$1,000).

Franklin Templeton Services, LLC (FTS) provides the Manager with fund accounting and portfolio valuation services in connection with the Fund, and provides certain back office administration services to the Manager. The Administration Fee, as discussed below, covers the cost of the services provided by FTS.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain fund costs—which include, but are not limited to, the cost of compliance with new governmental and regulatory requirements, fees and expenses of the Fund's Independent Review Committee (IRC), borrowing and interest costs and investor meeting costs (as permitted by Canadian securities regulation)—in exchange for the payment by the Fund of an annual fixed-rate administration fee of 0.16% plus applicable taxes, applied against the average daily net assets of the Fund ("Administration Fee"), except for Series PF, which has an annual Administration Fee of 0.15%, and Series O and OT, which have no annual Administration Fee. The Manager will pay all operating expenses of Series O and OT, as applicable, as part of its agreement with each investor. The Manager may, at its discretion, waive a portion of a series' Administration Fee or absorb certain fund costs. During the year ended December 31, 2017, the Fund paid Administration Fees of \$35,000 (2016—\$37,000).

Principal Distributor

As a principal distributor of the Fund, the Manager markets the Fund and arranges for the sale of the Fund through dealers across Canada. The Manager may retain companies to assist in the sale of certain series of shares of the Fund.

The Manager's affiliate, FTC Investor Services Inc. ("FTC ISI"), also acts as a principal distributor for Series F, O, OT, FT, PF and PF (Hedged) shares of the Fund, as applicable.

For acting as a principal distributor of the applicable series, FTC ISI receives an inter-company service fee of 0.20% of the assets under management of the applicable series from the Manager with respect to those series of shares.

Registrar and Transfer Agent

In addition to management and portfolio advisory services, the Manager acts as the registrar and transfer agent of the Fund. These services are in the normal course of operations and are covered by the Administration Fee paid by the Fund to the Manager.

Standing Instructions from the Independent Review Committee

The Manager relied on standing instructions from the IRC with respect to the allocation of any operating expenses not covered by the Administration Fee. The Manager relied, or may rely, on standing instructions from the IRC in respect of securities trades amongst mutual funds, investment funds or managed accounts managed by the Manager or an affiliate of the Manager. In both cases, the standing instructions require the Manager to comply with the policies and procedures presented to the IRC with respect to the above matters and to provide periodic reports to the IRC in accordance with NI 81-107.

MANAGEMENT FEES

A portion of the management fee paid by the Fund to the Manager is for trail fees and sales commissions the Manager pays to dealers ("Dealer Compensation"). The trail fees are a percentage of the daily average net asset value of each series of the Fund, which is held by the dealer's clients. The remaining portion of the management fee is used to pay for portfolio advisory and administrative services related to the provision of portfolio advisory services. The table below outlines the Fund's annual management fee, as well as the portion of the management fee used to pay for Dealer Compensation and for portfolio advisory services as an approximate percentage of the management fee for each series:

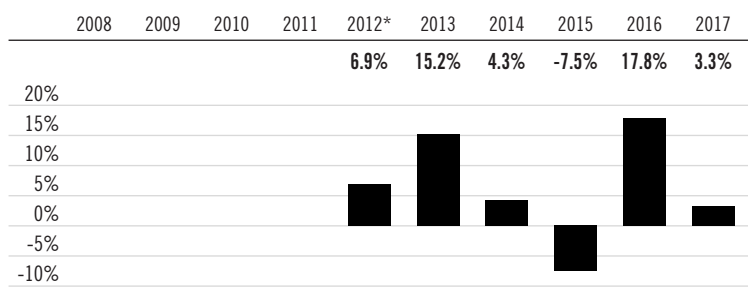

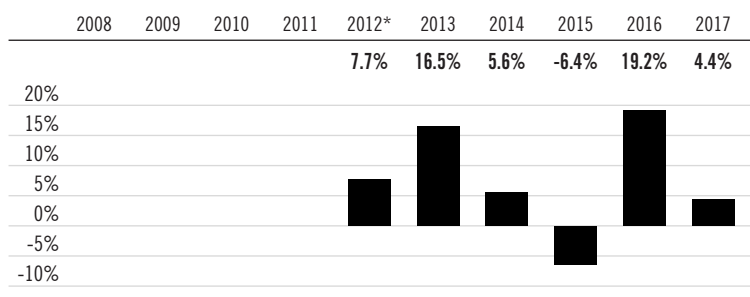

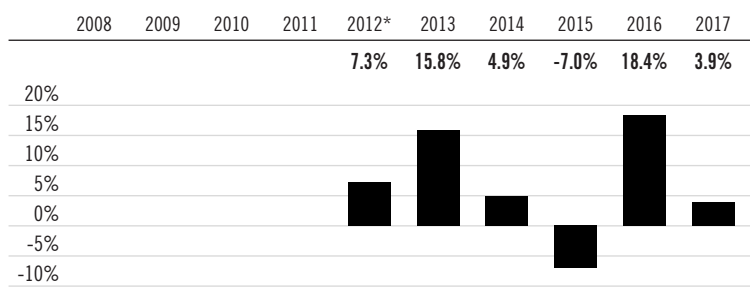

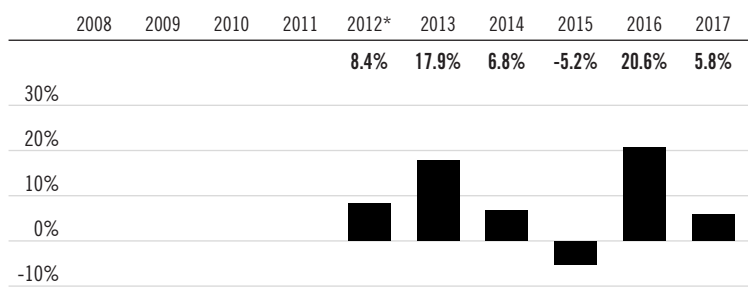

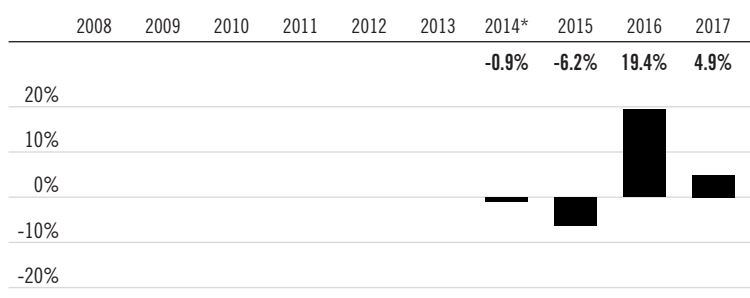

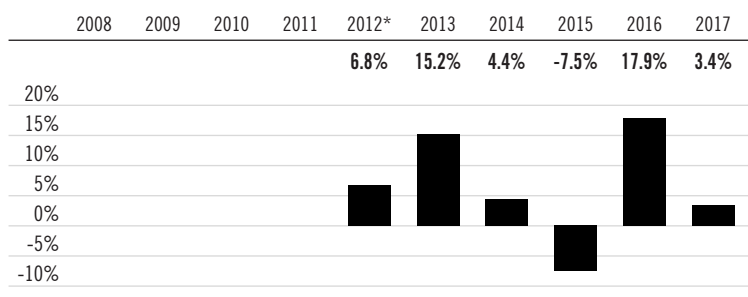

Net Assets per Share:

- (1) This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements. In the period a fund or series is established, the financial information is provided from the date of inception to the end of the period. In cases where the net assets per share presented in the financial statements differ from the net asset value calculated for Fund pricing purposes, an explanation of these differences can be found in the notes to the financial statements.
- (2) Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of shares outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease in net assets from operations is based on the weighted average number of shares outstanding over the fiscal period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of opening and closing net assets per share.
- (3) Dividends were paid in cash or reinvested in additional shares of the Fund or both, and exclude distributions of management fee reductions to shareholders.

Ratios and Supplemental Data:

- (1) This information is provided as at the period-end of the year shown.
- (2) Management expense ratio is based on total expenses for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

Custom Franklin Bissett Dividend Income Benchmark from June 30, 2012, to present comprises the S&P/TSX Composite TR Index (60%), FTSE TMX Canada Universe Bond TR Index (formerly the Scotia Capital Markets [SCM] Index, 15%), S&P 500 TR Index (20%) and S&P/TSX Preferred Share TR Index (5%). Previous to June 30, 2012, the Benchmark was made up of the S&P/TSX Composite TR Index (45%), DEX Universe Bond TR Index (formerly the Scotia Capital Markets [SCM] Index, 10%), S&P 500 TR Index (25%) and Nesbitt Burns Preferred Share TR Index (20%).
