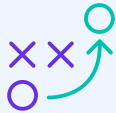


# Franklin U.S. Monthly Income Fund

### Why consider this fund?



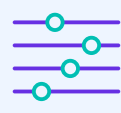
#### A strategic approach to stocks and bonds

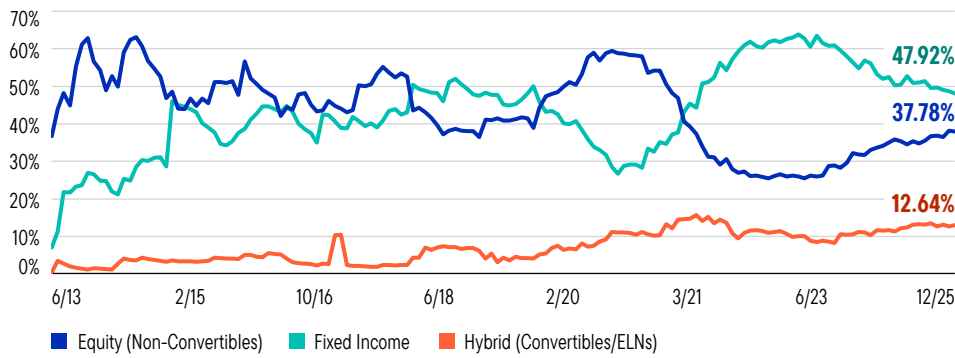

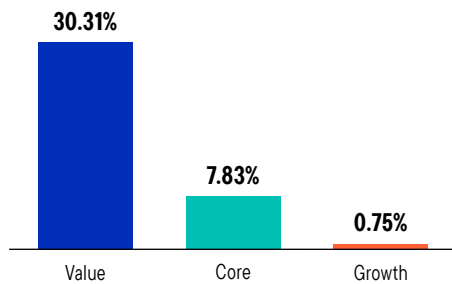

The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating," is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its 3-, 5-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Ratings metrics. The weights are 100% 3-year rating for 36–59 months of total returns, 60% 5-year rating/40% 3-year rating for 60–119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% 5-year rating/20% 3-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent 3-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all 3 rating periods. Franklin U.S. Monthly Income Fund is rated within the Morningstar Global Neutral Balanced category. All rating data refers to Series F units. Please refer to [www.morningstar.ca](http://www.morningstar.ca) for more details on the calculation of Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Ratings and the 1-year information. For each of the 1-, 3-, and 5-year performance periods, there were in total 1,563, 1,461 and 1,219 funds, respectively, in the Morningstar Global Neutral Balanced category.

### Tactical Allocation Shifts over Time<sup>3</sup>



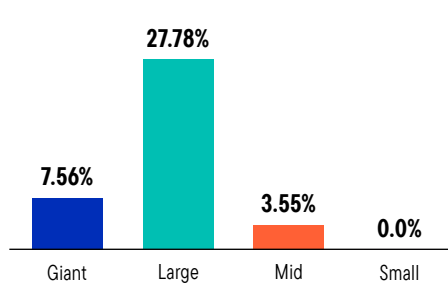
### Style (%)<sup>5</sup>

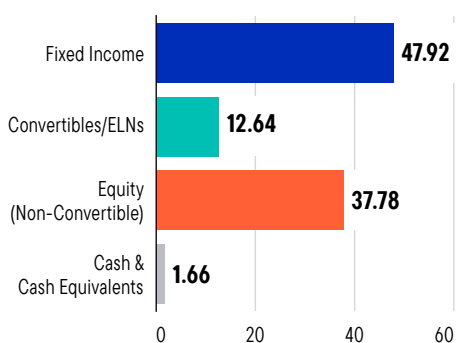

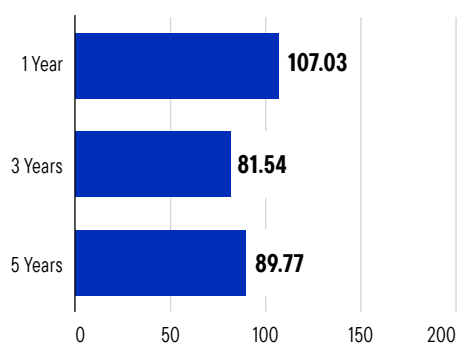

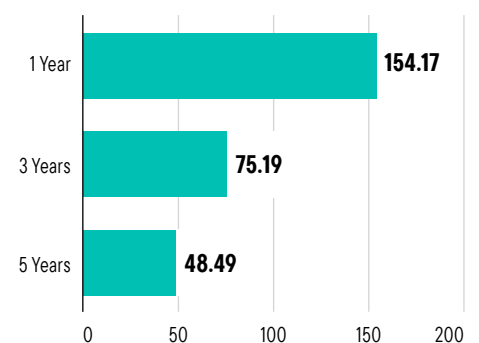
### Asset Allocation (%)<sup>4</sup>
